20 DENETHOR

Yes, I wish that.

FARAMIR

Since you are robbed of Boromir, I will do what I can in his stead.

ANGLE ON: FARAMIR bows low to DENETHOR, then turns to leave.

25 FARAMIR

If I should return ... think better of me, father.

DENETHOR

That will depend on the manner of your return.
